

Fall 2021 COVID-19 Pre-Departure and Arrival Expectations for International Travelers

Before your departure to the United States:

If you are not fully vaccinated[†] with a U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) or World Health Organization (WHO) approved COVID-19 vaccine[‡], limit interactions with others for 7 days prior to avoid being exposed to COVID-19.

Note: [U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention \(CDC\)](#) requires all air passengers entering the United States (including U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents) to present a negative COVID-19 test, taken within three calendar days of departure or proof of recovery from the virus within the last 90 days.

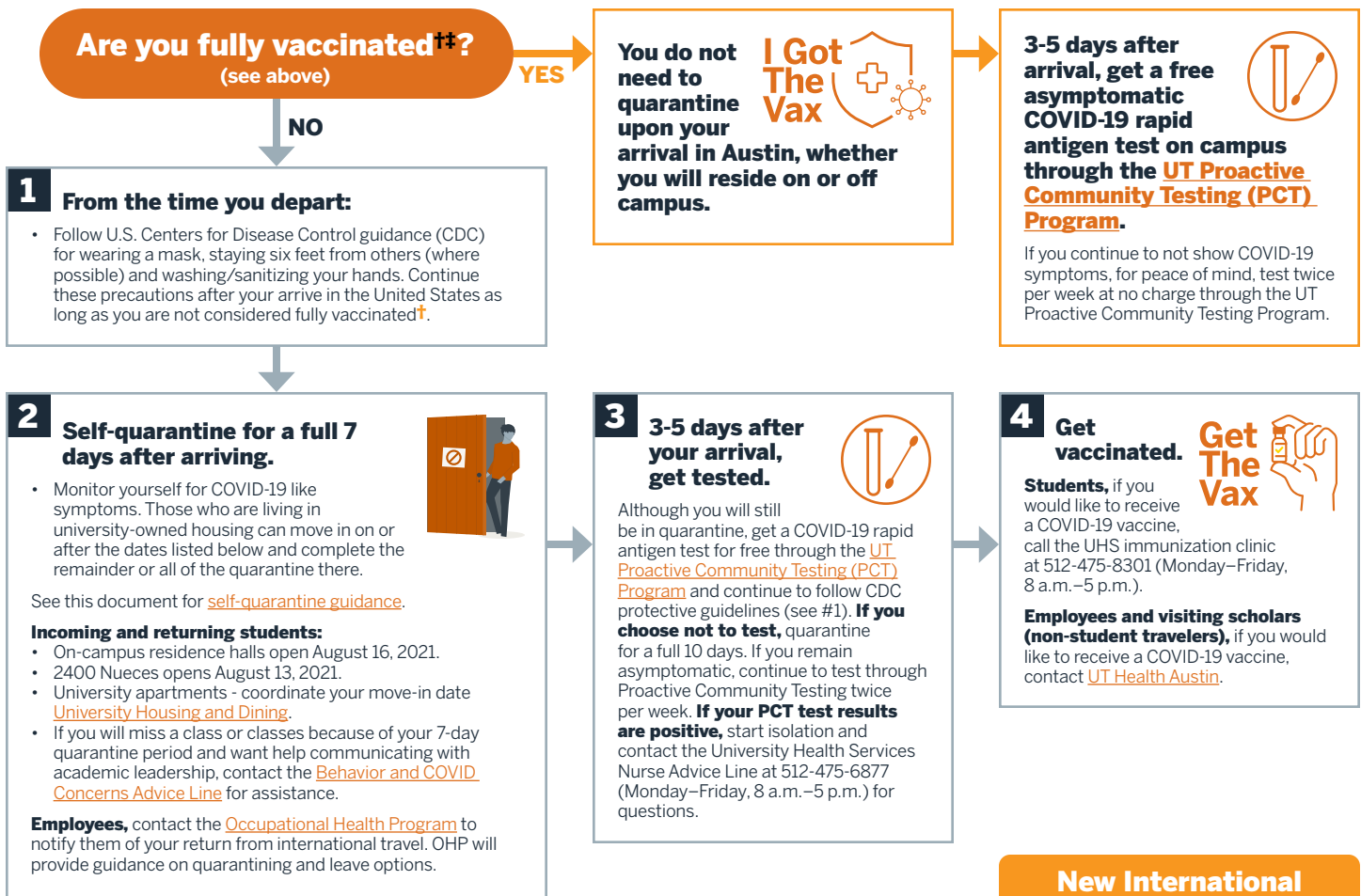
† You are fully vaccinated:

- 2 weeks after your second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine

‡ U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) or World Health Organization (WHO) approved COVID-19 vaccines include:

- Pfizer-BioNTech
- Moderna
- Sinopharm
- Johnson & Johnson/Janssen
- AstraZeneca/Oxford vaccine
- Sinovac

Upon arrival to Austin:



New International Students:

- If your PCT test results are negative, contact the University Health Services (UHS) immunization clinic at 512-475-8301 to schedule an appointment for required immunizations, tuberculosis testing, or an FDA-approved COVID-19 vaccine. If you experience COVID-19 like symptoms, isolate from others and contact the UHS Nurse Advice Line at 512-475-6877 (Monday–Friday, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.).
- If your PCT test results are positive, start isolation and contact the University Health Services Nurse Advice Line at 512-475-6877 (Monday–Friday, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.) for questions. Also, contact the University Health Services immunization clinic at 512-475-8301 to discuss making arrangements to obtain required immunizations and/or tuberculosis testing after the end of your 10-day isolation period.
